The purpose of the meeting was to address the Instructional Affairs Committee recommendation regarding internet speed.

The Instructional Affairs Committee voted on a list of web sites that may be blocked, prioritized, or open during peak instructional hours to help with the problem of slow internet speed. The voting choices were Block, Open, and Prioritize. Block meaning never have access, Open- having access even during peak instructional hours, and Prioritize - web sites are not blocked completely, but during peak hours getting to the site would be extremely slow or impossible.

The Committee recommended that the Faculty Senate accept it's vote on the websites listed on the attachment.
